Orbus Centre, Malawi, Africa:

The School: The Orbus kindergarten classes and junior primary school classes from grades 1-4 operated through the period. The new grade 4 class started well at the beginning of Term 1 in early September.







The Farm: The Orbus farm had continued success in the pig breeding project with lots of piglets born during the period. The rains came on time and a large crop of maize was planted and is growing well so far. Some of the fruit trees planted in 2011/2012 are producing fruit already.









Other Orbus Activities and News: Orbus Australia funded and organized for a new house to be built for a local grandmother who looks after her orphaned grandchildren. The house was completed in time to beat the rainy season. Orbus also were able to repair a well in a nearby area, replacing parts which were recently stolen. A visitor from Australia to the Orbus Centre in September emailed back a comment on his time there: "This is probably the most awesome experience I have had." Orbus Australia is still looking for a representative to be based in Blantyre and in the meantime a young missionary family from the US are living in the Orbus house in Blantyre.











Malawi News: The biggest financial scandal in Malawi's history, called "Cashgate," has been the biggest story in Malawi recently and has contributed to a crisis of confidence among foreign donors. It has been reported that up to 30% of the nation's budget has been looted over the last 10 years. Foreign donors give large amounts of money to Malawi every year, amounting to approximately 40% of the national budget, and like gifts from foreign churches, including cash and container loads of goods, these funds are provided by foreign well-wishers with Malawi's poor and needy as the intended recipients, yet much of it is plundered by the rich and influential and never reaches those it was intended for.
